## **Social and Trauma History** (Current living situation, employment status, pertinent legal history, level of education, relationship status, children, support system, etc.)

Member and her two siblings (brother age 6 with anger issues, sister age 12) were taken away from their parents due to drugs and her grandparents are legal guardians. Both parents used marijuana and meth. Confirmed in member's umbilical cord.

SSI is pending to provide financial support to the grandparents.

Member sees a Neurologist, Orthopedics, and a Vision specialist. She is also in aquatic therapy, PT, OT, and ST. Grandmother is not sure why she needs ST as the member is verbal. Grandmother has concerns about the member's brother being a threat to the member as he has BH issues, but she is also aware that her husband seems to interact in an angrier manner toward the child, so she said they are working on this.

Member attends school and grandpa picks them up as grandma works FT from home.

Member throws tantrums at times, like when she does not want to do her homework or get her flu shot. Grandma took days off of work to work with the member on doing her homework on the iPad. She will also try to use a treat as a reward to get her flu shot on the weekend.
